

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Named for Leon M. Abbott, Sovereign Grand Commander from 1921 to 1932, the scholarship program provides financial support for the continuing education of young men and women from the Scottish Rite families and Masonic-related youth groups. Since 1951, more than \$3 million has been awarded to students from each state of the Northern Jurisdiction.

Eligibility: Those meeting any of the following criteria are eligible to apply for the 2017 Abbott Scholarship Program:

- A Scottish Rite Mason of the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction
- A child of a Scottish Rite Mason of the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction, who is currently enrolled at an
 accredited college or university, who has attained a minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0
 scale.
- (Freshman Scholarships will be distributed after an acceptable GPA is submitted, following the first semester).
- A member of a youth organization sponsored by the Masonic fraternity in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.

Applicants should print the form, and complete it, and mail it to the appropriate Valley Secretary. Fill out two forms. Applicants should submit their application to their father's Valley. Deadline is April 1, 2017.

The officers of the Scottish Rite Valley of New Castle would like to dispose of two investment accounts managed by Huntington Bank as Agent Trust Company of Trustees of the Scottish Rite Valley of New Castle. The name of the two accounts which we would like to dispose of are The Organ Fund and the Permanent Organ Fund. A motion was made at the Executive Committee Meeting on January 1, 2017, revising the motion that was made at the June 15, 2016 Stated Meeting of the Valley of New Castle.

The Officers of the Valley of New Castle present, moved and allowed the transfer of The Organ Fund in its entirety to the Cathedral Foundation to an account by the same name held by the Officers of the Cathedral Foundation, for the sole purpose of maintenance of the Moller five Manual Pipe Organ. or apportion thereof to an account by the same name held by the Officers of the Cathedral Foundation or apportion thereof may be retained by the Valley of New Castle and deposited in the General Checking account, or in account and use to be determined by the Executive Committee. The Permanent Organ Fund must set aside the amount of the original bequest of \$10,000.00 and must remain in the Permanent Organ Fund. The remainder of the monies in the Permanent Organ Fund account is to be transferred to the Cathedral Foundation to an account by the same name held by the Officers of the Cathedral Foundation in total thereof.

The Trustees of the Valley of New Castle and their successors in the Trust must maintain the Permanent Organ Fund. This fund must have minimum balance of no less than \$10,000.00. This is the amount original bequest and shall not be invaded. The income, interest, and dividends arising from the investments of such funds shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Cathedral Foundation and placed in the Organ Fund to be used only for the continued maintenance of the Moller Five Manual Pipe Organ, this must be done no less than once a year. The organ is in front of the auditorium of the New Castle Scottish Rite Cathedral.

This motion will be presented at the Stated meeting of the Valley of New Castle on January 18, 2017, and will lie over without debate, until the next Stated meeting of the Valley of New Castle and notices must sent to the membership to be considered and acted upon; and if it shall then be approved by a majority of the members present, it shall be adopted.

As of January 14, 2017, the Deputy for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Ill. Thomas K. Sturgeon, 33°:

Has given formal approval of the combining of the Life Annuity Fund and the Life Membership Fund which are under the control of the Trustee of the Valley of New Castle, into a new account which shall be called "ANNUITY MEMBERSHIP FUND" in accordance with the Supreme Council Constitution, and continue under the Control of the Trustee of the Valley of New Castle. From this date forward the Life Annuity Fund and the Life Membership Fund will be titled as follows the "Annuity Membership Fund."
